DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:

The work involves responsibility for performing semi-skilled, manual work involving the maintenance performance of installation tasks on water mains, hydrants and meters. Complex work is performed under the immediate supervision of the Town Supervisor while routine tasks may be performed under general supervision and inspected upon completion. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: (Illustrative Only)

Monitors for system chlorine residual;

Monitors water storage quantities;

Monitors sewage flow in the collection system;

Maintains the Emergency Management Plan;

Maintains records and maps for the water system;

Maintains, repairs and operates water distribution and treatment equipment as required;

Maintains and repairs sewer mains and manholes;

Collects monthly bacteria samples;

Collects water samples as directed by the Health Department;

Locates water lines as requested by Underground Facilities Protection Organization;

Periodically flushes lines to maintain water quality;

Inspects system connections;

Locates water and sewer lines;

May operate a truck or other in connection with the above work;

Operates, repairs and maintains sewer lift station pumps;

Responds at all times to emergency repair calls;

Processes monthly reports;

Performs meter readings;

Performs repairs and rebuilds pressure reducing valves;

Performs custodial duties in connection with maintenance of buildings and grounds;

Performs other duties as assigned.
