SPECIFIC PROGRAM AREA(S):

This position will coordinate the **Communicable Disease**, **Rabies**, **and Tuberculosis** programs. This position works closely with healthcare provider offices, school nurses, local hospitals, and community partners in following up on New York State reportable diseases; completes rabies investigations; coordinates rabies clinics; and investigates and case manages active and latent tuberculosis cases. This position is part of the rabies on call team and works at monthly immunization clinics administering vaccines to children and adults.

This vacancy can be filled with one of the following titles (see job descriptions & requirements for each below): Public Health Specialist, Public Health Nurse, or Registered Nurse

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS:			
Public Health Specialist	Public Health Nurse or Registered Nurse		
This position involves responsibility for planning, developing, administering, coordinating, and evaluating activities that help improve health outcomes for Yates County's population. These activities can take place in a variety of settings that include schools, communities, health care facilities, businesses, universities, and government agencies. This is done by assessing community needs, assets, and capacity; then planning health strategies, interventions, and programs. Public Health Specialists administer the strategies, interventions, and programs, and also act as community resources and advocates for health prevention and promotion. Other work responsibilities include conducting communicable disease and rabies case investigations. The work is performed under the general supervision of the Deputy Director of Public Health and the Director of Public Health, with leeway allowed for use of independent judgement. Supervision may be exercised over	This position involves responsibility to provide public health nursing services to individuals, families, and population groups. Nursing actions are directed toward the goals of prevention, assessment, risk reduction, and health status improvement for individuals, families and communities. Nursing activities include, but are not limited to, systematic analysis of health data, health education and advocacy, coalition building, and collaborating with community partners to promote the health of a population. Public Health Nurses/Registered Nurses often collaborate and consult within multidisciplinary and multi-agency teams in order to achieve desirable outcomes for families and communities. Public Health nursing interventions occur at individual, family, community and system levels depending upon the responsibilities of the position and the program or issues involved. This position involves responsibility for planning, developing, administering,		

various subordinate professional, technical, and clerical personnel. Does related work as required.

coordinating and evaluating activities for Public Health programs. Other work responsibilities may include conducting communicable disease and rabies case investigations, administering immunizations, and participation in Performance Management and Quality Improvement. Work is performed under the general direction of the Deputy Director of Public Health or Director of Public Health and in accordance with the New York State Nurse Practice Act. Supervision may be exercised over Registered Professional Nurses (Public Health Nurse only), Licensed Practical Nurses, and General Support Staff. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES (Illustrative Only):

Public Health Specialist

- Assist with and promote / support various health assessment plans including the Community Health Assessment and Community Health Improvement Plan;
- Develop, implement, and report on community needs assessment efforts in conjunction with other departments and community agencies;
- Assess the health status of those served and their related determinants of health, and use this knowledge to plan, educate, inform and make referrals as appropriate;
- Assist the community to design program services and develop strategies to address health disparities in Yates County;
- Lead, supervise, and direct the development of new workgroups designed to respond to specific population-based health risks;
- Develop, plan, evaluate, and support community efforts to coordinate and integrate community health and behavioral health care;
- Research evidence based-strategies, promising practices, and potential funding streams to promote population health;
- Collaborate with various public and private agencies regarding planning and operation of strategic health planning utilizing new technologies and media;
- Develop demographic, statistical, programmatic, and scientific presentations, brochures and products utilizing new technologies and media:
- Organize, motivate, and facilitate diverse groups;
- Represent the Public Health Department and Yates County on specific boards, coalitions, and planning groups, as assigned;
- Act as the agency's liaison / linkage with individuals, agencies, community members and government representatives;
- Conduct communicable disease and rabies investigations due to exposure or diagnosis;
- Assess and evaluate community readiness for healthy lifestyle changes by various groups, i.e., age, institutions, and local communities;
- Participate in public health preparedness activities as trained and assigned;

Public Health Nurse or Registered Nurse

- Assesses the health status of those served and their related determinants of health, and uses this knowledge to educate, inform, and make referrals as appropriate;
- Conveys public health information in writing and orally, in person and through electronic means, with linguistic and cultural proficiency in the appropriate format and health literacy level of the population served;
- Develops demographic, statistical, programmatic, and scientific presentations, brochures, and products;
- May teach classes, address or facilitate groups, and participate in community partnerships to promote population health;
- Participates and/or leads program planning, implementation, and evaluation;
- Reports program performance and completion of work plan objectives;
- Participates in the conduct of surveys and assessments related to health matters:
- Compiles and uses records, reports, and statistical information for planning and evaluation of public health programs;
- Participates in or leads quality improvement projects;
- Investigates reports of communicable disease and infection;
- Completes and maintains activity records, patient files, and program records in compliance with Nursing Standards, Grant requirements, and NYSDOH regulations;
- Administers immunizations and biologics, and performs specimen collection and shipment for patients in the community setting and in clinics;
- Coordinates and monitors the delivery of available services;
- May provide nursing oversight to Registered Professional Nurses (Public Health Nurse only) and Licensed Practical Nurses in the administration of Immunizations or biologics;
- Participates in emergency preparedness planning and response efforts;
- Performs other duties as assigned.

The majority of all Civil Service exams are scheduled by NYS Civil Service. Some exams, for example, are only given every 4 years, so it is in our best interest to give such exams when offered in order to be prepared. If a position is vacant or will become vacant, a Yacancy Announcement will be distributed and, on that announcement, it includes the work location along with other pertinent details pertaining to the location for which the vacancy will occur. Yes Announcements are different from Vacancy Announcements and should not be misconstrued as being an advertisement for an open position.
